#### 2015-2016 Annual Goal 1

Students will become more knowledgeable of faith as indicated in the Assessment of Catholic Religious Education results of Grade 5 and in ability to apply faith teaching and principals in daily life situations per teacher observation.

Summary: The assessment of Catholic Religious Education (ACRE) is give annually in grade 5 and considered to be a program assessment rather than one of individual students in areas of Knowledge of the Faith, Liturgical Life, Moral Formation, Prayer, Communal Life, Missionary Spirit and includes a section on application or concerns.

In May 2016 Grade 5 St. Mary Students took the Assessment of Catholic Religious Education. Scores below show St. Mary School students compared to national scores.

#### 2015-2016 Annual Goal 2

Student performance will show a +.75-1.0 growth increment in National Grade Equivalent (NGE) for reading.

Summary: The goal was met. The NGE for English Language Art total (Grade 4) was 5.0 in 2014-2015. The same cohort (Grade 5) had a NGE of 6.7 in English Language Art total for the 2015-2016 school year. This reflects a NGE increase of 1.7.

Strategies for 2015-2016 goal attainment include student performance analysis, small group instruction, monthly review of individual student progress, articulation with teachers of other levels, and goal development strategies for instructional implementation during staff development.

#### 2015-2016 Annual Goal 3

Student performance will show a +.75-1.0 growth increment in NGE for math.

Summary: The goal was met. The NGE for Math Total (Grade 4) was 4.1 in 2014-2015. The same cohort (Grade 5) had a NGE of 5.1 in Math Total for the 2015-2016 school year. This reflects a NGE increase of 1.0.

Strategies for 2015-2016 goal attainment include student performance analysis, small group instruction, emphasis of computation skills and problem solving skills, continued articulation with teachers of other levels, monthly pacing meetings with the principal, and instructional implementation strategies for goal development during staff development sessions.

#### 2015-2016 Annual Goal 4

Student performance will show a +.75-1.0 growth increment in NGE for Science.

Summary: The goal was met. The NGE for Science (Grade 4) was 5.3 in 2014-2015. The same cohort (Grade 5) had a NGE of 6.9 in Science for the 2015-2016 school year. This reflects a NGE increase of 1.6.

Strategies for 2015-2016 goal attainment include student performance analysis, practice in measurement, analyzing, and describing data, articulation with other teachers regarding the total school program, monthly pacing meetings with principal, and goal development strategies for instructional implementation during staff development sessions.

#### Sources of Assessment Data Used in This Report

Goal 1 for religion is assessed by the Assessment of Catholic Religious Education. This is a national objective, formal instrument used annually throughout the United States at the Grade 5, 8 and 11 levels.

Goals 2-4 in reading and science areas are reported for Grade 4 as required by the state. Iowa Assessments are administered annually to Grades 1-6 in early November. The Grade 4 information in this report is from November 2015 covering the first quarter of 4<sup>th</sup> grade in 2016 and the 3 previous quarters of grade 3.

#### **Long Range Goals 2016-2017**

1. Students will increase in knowledge of faith and its daily applications.
2. Students will improve in reading skills.
3. Students will improve in mathematics skills.
4. Students will improve in science.
